


FRANKLIN J. KELLER, Principal


As many of you boys and girls know, I have often asked you just what experiences in and out of school have really taught you about life. Now, I ask you again what would your ideal school be like, what kind of institution would you want to attend to the end of your days? What manner of learning would be a joy forever? Sounds zany, doesn't it?

But it isn't! Just think of some book, or play or poem or concert or dance, to which you have become attached, some work of art, perhaps a phantom ship, that you carry around in your mind or soul or pocket or handbag, something of great delight. I have dreamed again and again of a whole long series of delights that such a school should be.

J. B. Priestley has been my able colleague in this matter of Delight. He has written a whole book under that title. Professing to be an incorrigible old grumbler,

he has set down in one hundred eleven essays one hundred and eleven ways in which he can enjoy life at its superlative best-all the way from "Coming of an Idea" to "Not Having to Bring a Report Card Home to His Father." In one of his little pieces he tells of high "Moments in the Morning" when he arrives in his study like a demigod who has been given a planet to play with. When he, a writer, gets down to it, his work will be wonderful. "And brighter than the gilt along the bookshelves are the illusions of the moment . . . critics are kind and wise . . . readers and audiences, are enchanted . . . income tax is sixpence in the pound . . . the United Nations consist of united nations . . . and high and shining in the regard of all good folk everywhere is that sagacious, witty and tender, profound writer . . ." (more to come).

I too have had my High Moments in the Morning-



and in the Afternoon. A few days ago, responding dejectedly to a seriously unfavorable criticism of our work, Mr. Luloff and I, spontaneously and unannounced, took off on a two-hour safari through the Main Building, leaving no student or teacher unturned. When we were back again in the office, we looked at each other in a kind of dazed bewilderment and shook hands to prove that we were still in a real world. We had started out to carp but remained to praise. Literally we had seen nothing to criticize adversely, pupils and teachers were dynamic and creative in shops and classrooms. Eager, industrious, sometimes brilliant activity-everywhere. A little later, somewhat fearful of my continued good fortune, I set out solo on a similar tour in Performing Arts-with Dr. Paine figuratively at my side. At the end of an hour and a half I was thrilled with the perceptive, imaginative, creative, live dynamism of our boys and girls, men and women.

Then there was the day on the John W. Brown! Socony Day. The Superintendent, Captain, Engineer and five other Socony officials were there, along with Grace Brennan, Director of Cooperative Education, and Charles O'Toole, Director of Placement from the Board of Education. Best of all were the parents of five graduates who are sailing on Socony ships. Capt. Schellings and the teachers were gracious hosts. As in the Main Building and S.P.A., the students this time in merchant marine uniforms, were superb.


I know—you will read this and say, "It can't all be true at any one time." You will show it to your parents and, if they are kind, they will simply raise many eyebrows. But it *is* true, for we are talking about moments in the morning, of immediately observable work and conduct, of general impressions. And all this is wonderful.

If you will concede this much then let's go back to Mr. Priestley—Here is the "(more to come):" "... sagacious, witty, tender, profound writer ... who, now waking from his daydream, sits down, a fat, grumpy fellow to slog away until lunchtime." Of course, we know that Priestley is really sagacious, witty, and so on, and that his work too is wonderful, just because he can both dream and slog away. We know still better that underneath, and therefore supporting these beautiful pictures of school life, are sweat, pains, and tears, as well as intelligence and good will. We know that other tours at other times can and do turn up all sorts of weaknesses and defects ... But these particular tours revealed the best.

Your life in school should parallel what goes on in the world around you. Before and behind the production of a beautiful play or concert, the exhibition of stunning photographs, the proud sailing of an American liner out of New York Harbor, lies all the strange conflict of tense human beings-the struggle for power, status and for fair play. This means one hundred twenty concerned adults and nearly two thousand eager young people, each one working for his or her own finest development as well as for that of all others, must live and learn and sometimes clash-in an institution called a school. It means that somebody must keep the tempers temperate, the bearings cool, and the atmosphere clear. And that's why I, after painting a charming (and wholly accurate) picture of your production-Metropolitan Vocational High School -must wake up and slog away until, and after, lunchtime-and so will you, if you want to be happy.

That you may slog away incessantly, successfully, beautifully, and happily, is the earnest wish of your principal—


## SONG



A seed is planted in the ground, Deep under and out of view. And soon the ground doth part away. And the flower comes peeping through.


'Tis Birth!
