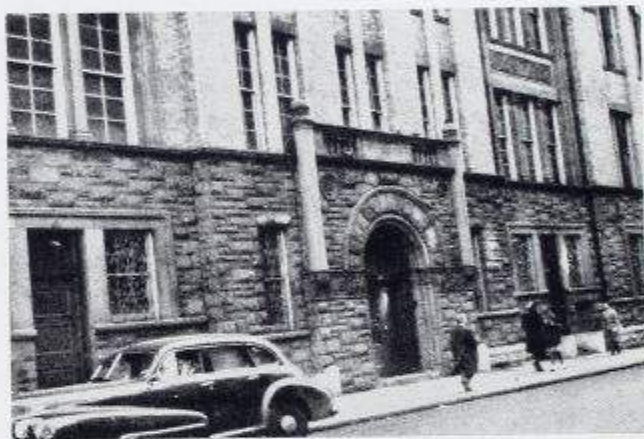

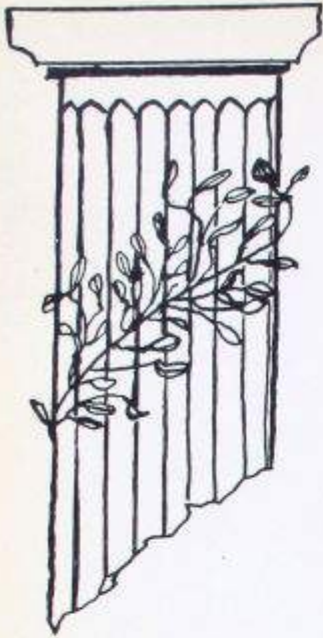

I remember the exciting trip we took through the fabulous dream photo lab in Rockefeller Center.

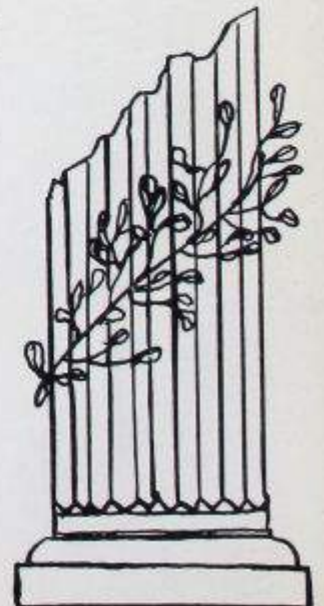
I remember the fascinating senior projects in music, dance, and drama—each one professionally adequate in its own right.

Dear Graduates:

I find myself preaching. I would rather not. Please credit it to a teacher's urge to get the last word in, especially to a group of graduates—a group to whom I wish the best and who I hope as they grow older will be "understanding" of the young people who will follow them.

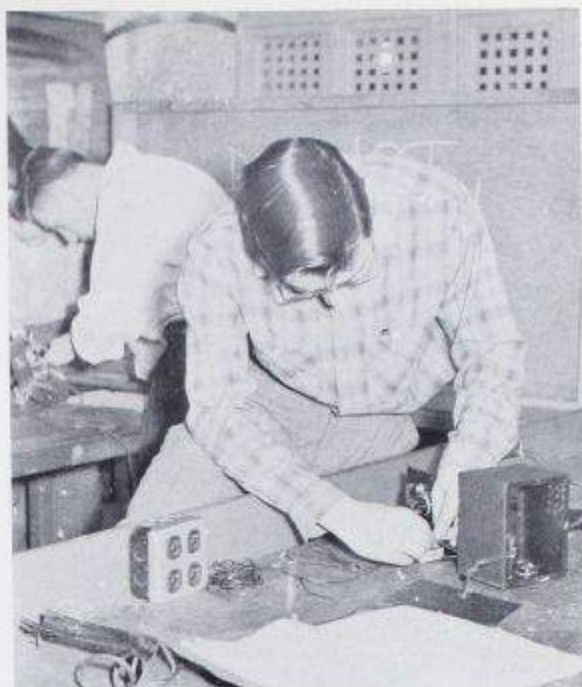


. . . In the Deck Department, the boys will learn those traits and abilities which seamen must possess: from practical deck work to the fundamentals of navigation. A typical week aboard ship should include lessons in cargo handling and general seamanship.

In the Steward Department, concentration will be on cooking, baking and other aspects of steward work.



As Man pursues the hidden wonders of the universe, should not the student be cognizant of these discoveries? He could receive training in both the theoretical and practical aspects of the telephone, bell systems, circuit wiring, motor servicing and rebuilding, stage lighting, and house wiring. After graduation, many of these students would be able to enter higher institutions to study electrical technology, engineering, and related subjects.



"A woman's face is her fortune." So it is, always has been and always will be. It is most fitting that this vision of the double-purpose school include a chance for the student to learn the Art of Beauty Culture and Barbering. Here the mysteries of paint, rouge and pomade will be revealed and the student will ply his trade in classrooms simulating the finest in modern workshops.



For those electrical students who wish to specialize in Radio Communication, a course could be offered giving extensive training in three phases: technical, servicing and operating. When specialization begins, the students may work and experiment in fully-equipped shops. The laboratory could also operate an amateur radio station with the call letters "W2 WS 1."

"The Quality of the Performance is in the Performer." A course in the Drama could be offered to students interested in the theater. All the fundamentals necessary to the development of technique in the young actor: Dance to train the body, Voice and Diction for the speech and Acting itself will be included. Students will learn to analyze plays, build characters and apply stage make-up. In their last term, when they are ready to start on the career, students will have the opportunity to listen to and benefit from the experiences of those who trod the boards before them. Most important, the embryonic actor will be able to perform before audiences and benefit from this.





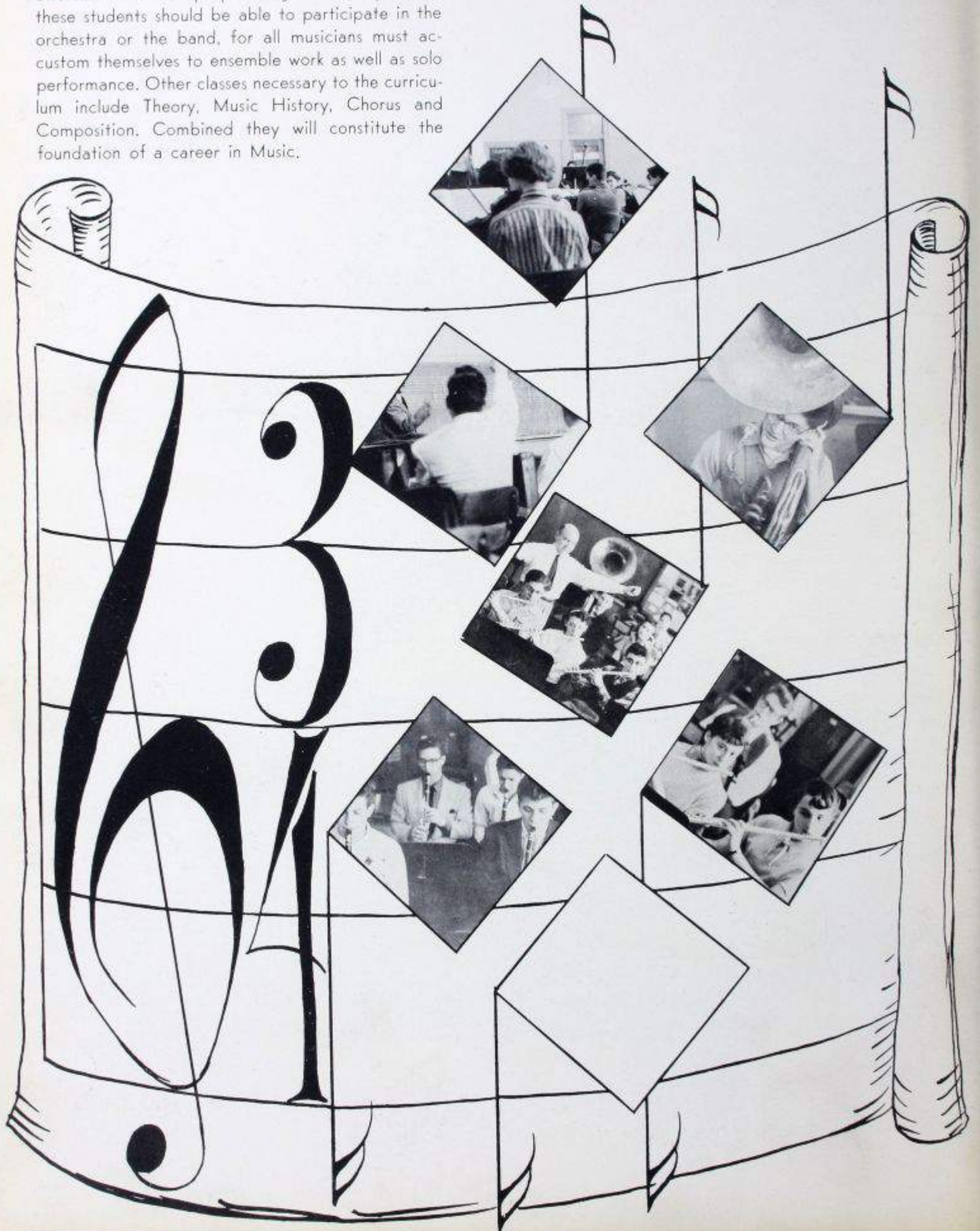

In the school I envision, Music in all its aspects will be studied. Only students who have musical ability aside from the technical skill will be admitted to this department. Since those who desire a musical career should have a well-rounded education in the field, study of a secondary instrument will be offered. After the proper length of study, all of these students should be able to participate in the orchestra or the band, for all musicians must accustom themselves to ensemble work as well as solo performance. Other classes necessary to the curriculum include Theory, Music History, Chorus and Composition. Combined they will constitute the foundation of a career in Music.
