

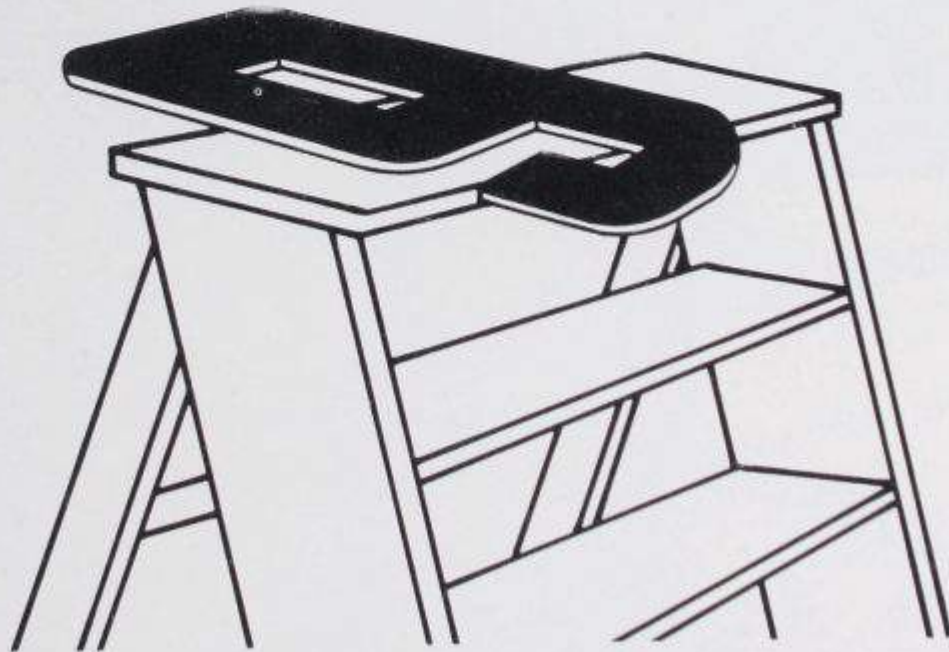




To the Graduates
