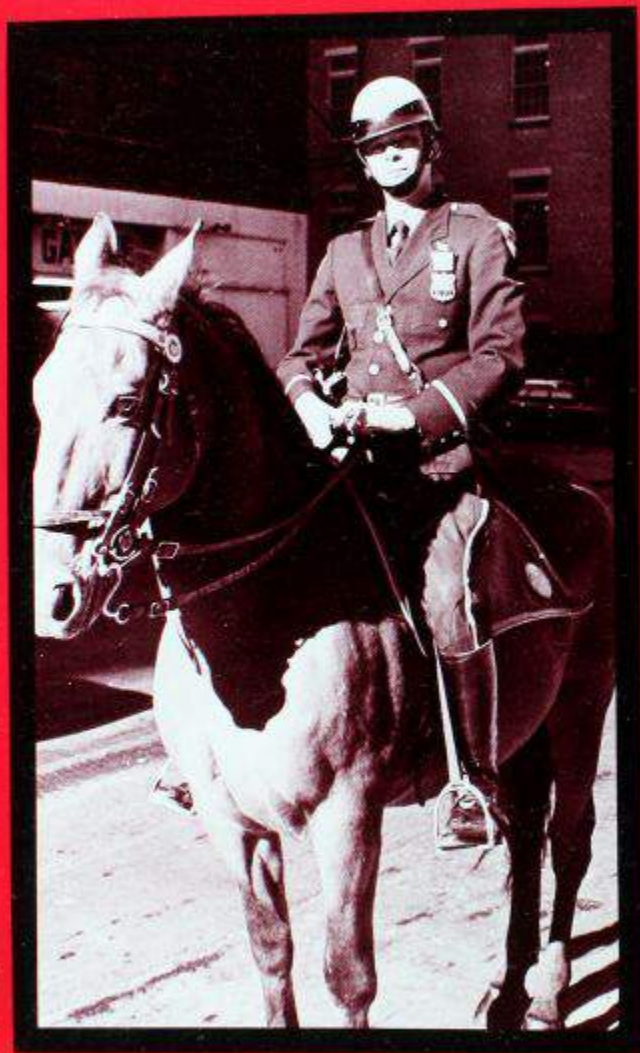






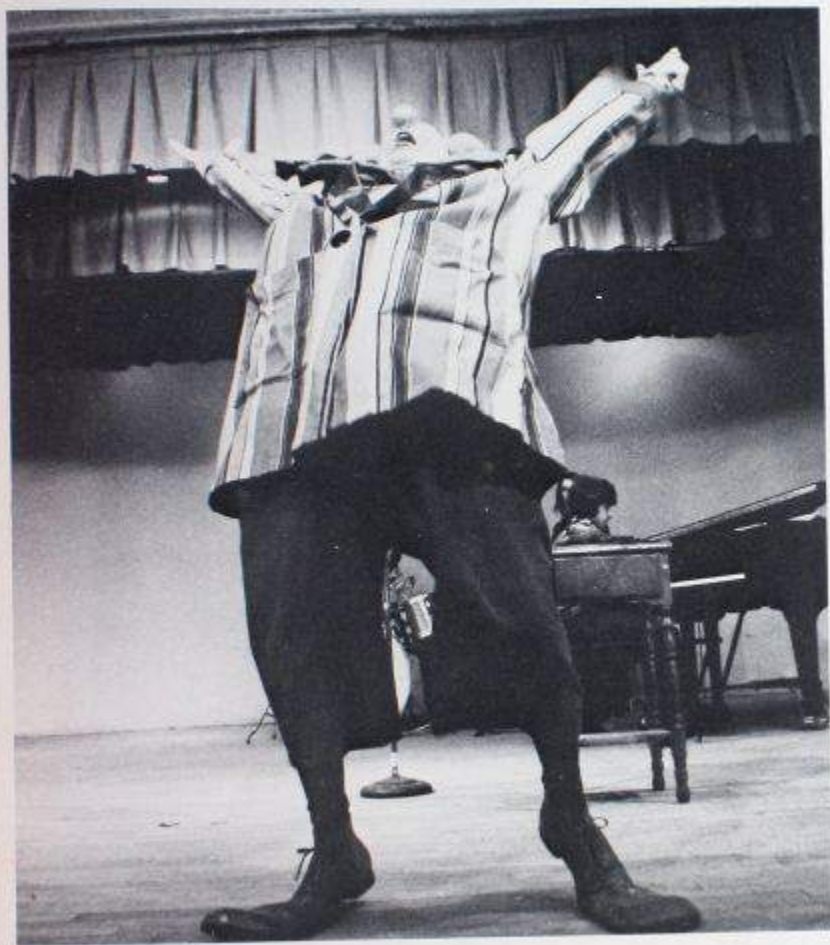






On the day the color,
