My Valedictory

One of you lovely graduates has said to me that there is something special in our leaving the school together. That's exactly how I feel about each of you. We have finished our high school course, we are going out together. You, my dear children, have been my advisors, my counselors, my teachers, my good companions. And now I must say good-bye.

As another graduate wrote a long time ago,
*"Methinks when I stand in life's sunset,

I shall see the bright faces of children

We have learned from each other. You have taught me more than you can ever know. But I should like to tell you how precious this learning is to me and how I shall take it with me into my new ventures. For, when I speak of you, I speak of myself. When I speak of myself, I speak of you.

You boys and girls have been adventuring, always exploring, ever eager to experiment, to *do* what the world and your own eager spirits have impelled you to do. You know that every experience, happy or unhappy, at home, in other homes, in your house of worship, while traveling, yes, even in school, has been part of your course of study, an item in making the personality you are, and will be. So you must keep on with your performance, whether on stage, aboard ship, in the studio—wherever. And so must I. For that is education, and we can never be through with it.

However, never for a moment think that wild bursts of activity solve anything. Along with the admirable energy that is yours, must go discipline, order, understanding — contemplation. Thinking quietly alone about what you are doing, evaluating your results, judging your actions — the contemplative mood — all this leads to great — really great, really wholesome

accomplishment. Take time to plan a project, perform it with deliberation, criticize it, let it lie fallow for a while, then come back and tackle it anew, and you will surprise yourself. It may be a dance, a scene, a piece of music, a photograph, a rehaul of an engine, but contemplation will have made it a masterpiece.

How do you remember what you think you have learned? How many significant incidents in your life — incidents which should have changed you into a stronger, better person — have passed into oblivion? If you had recorded them at the time, written letters about them, pondered them, generalized upon them, predicted how you would handle them the next time, you would have been writing your own text-book in education. You would have been authoring your own *Commonplace Book*. You who have been in my seminars know what that is. It would be the most valuable note-book you ever kept. I learned this late in life. You could learn it now. I have already written six text-books, but now that I am graduating, I plan to write three more, and whether you know it or not, you will be my co-authors!

Of course, *you* must learn to write—well. You *will*, if you have something you very much want to say, especially if you use the many resources that you have at hand, that school has helped you to use. It is an old question: If you were marooned on a desert isle what one book would you wish to have with you? Only a few days ago I learned that somebody else has chosen the one which I had selected years ago—Webster's *Unabridged Dictionary*! If I were to be on such an island and particularly lucky, I would also have *Roget's Thesaurus*. With a good stack of paper and enough ball-point pens, I would be turning out — immortal literature! — until some of you maritime boys came to rescue me.

While we are talking about literature (which, as you know, is simply, but superbly, the story of people like you and me and all the other guys and dolls), what book do you consider so great that you keep it next to your bed so that you can dip into it from time to time for wisdom and guidance? (None!? none at all!? Never thought of it?). I have five. You will need

a few more years of experience before you will be ready for them, so the names will be unimportant to you. But "The Man Who Lived Twice," the story of Edward Sheldon, the dramatist, would thrill you, and you could go back to it again and again for inspiration. You and I will become real persons yet, if we keep on with our education.

If you have read my valedictory up to this point, you are probably wondering how you made me such a hard taskmaster. The answer is simple: I love you. You remember what Romeo says:

*"Good night. Good night! Parting is
such sweet sorrow
That I shall say good night till
it be morrow."*

I would fain (to echo Shakespeare) say good-bye until it be next year, ten years, an eon from now. But this must really be a terminal good-bye.

Along with Joseph Conrad, I would say to the mariners:

"—Goodbye, brothers! You were a good crowd. As good a crowd as ever fisted with wild cries the beating canvas of a heavy foresail; a tossing aloft, invisible in the night, gave back yell for yell to a westerly gale."

Clarence Day provides the words for the performing artists.

*Farewell my friends — farewell
and hail!
I'm off to seek the Holy Grail
I cannot tell you why,
Remember, please, when I am gone,
'Twas an aspiration led me on.
Tiddlely, widdlely, tootle-oo.
All I want is to stay with you.
But here I go. Good-bye."*

For all of you, Paul says:

"Whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things."

When Alice got downstairs she saw people painting faces on themselves, painting trees, stars, and other people.



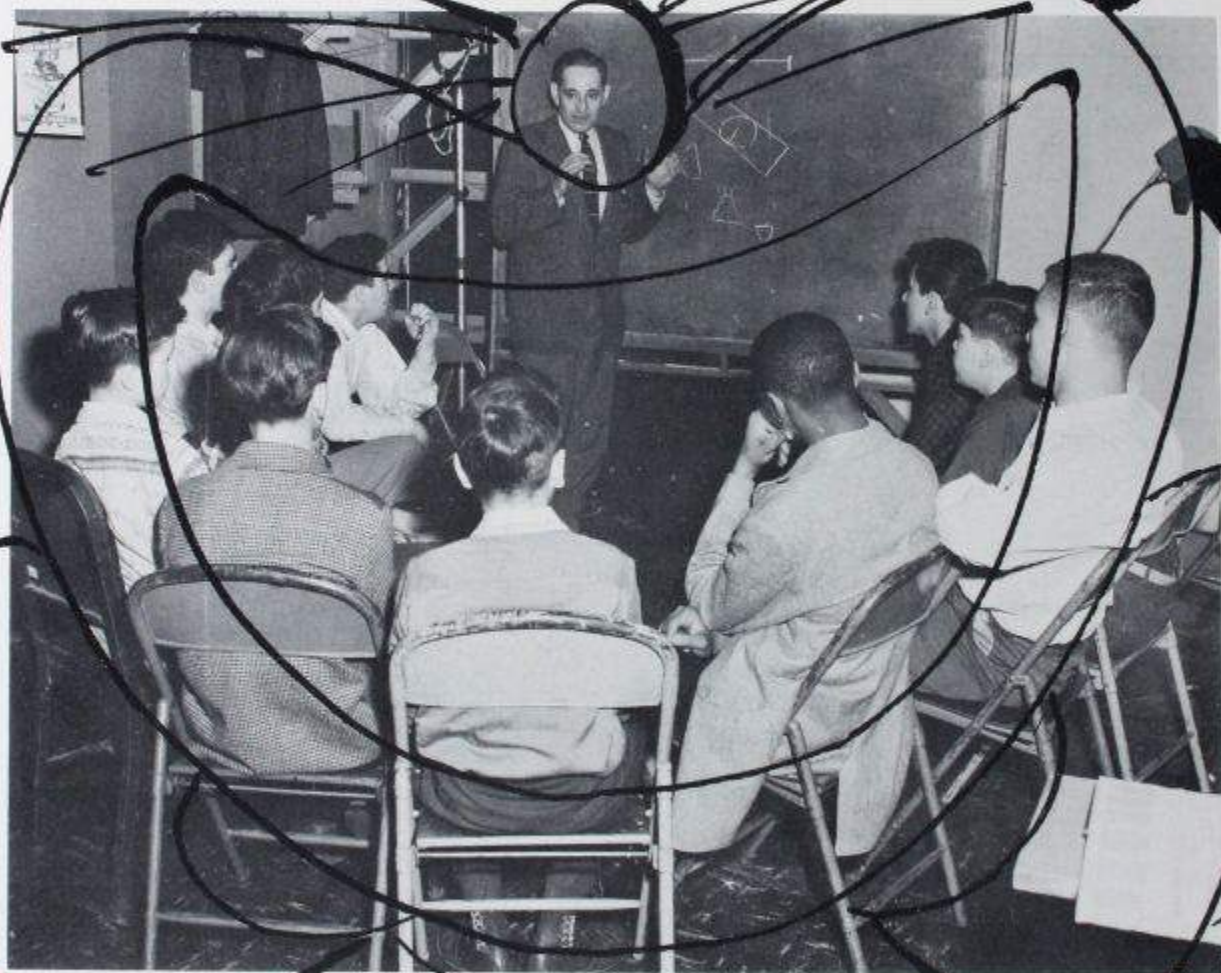


"May I come to your ball?" asked Alice.
