It is our hope that these personal qualities, so vital and necessary, will be with you and contribute to your success beyond Metropolitan.

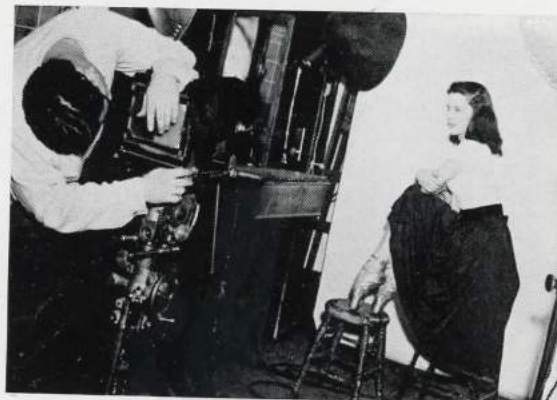
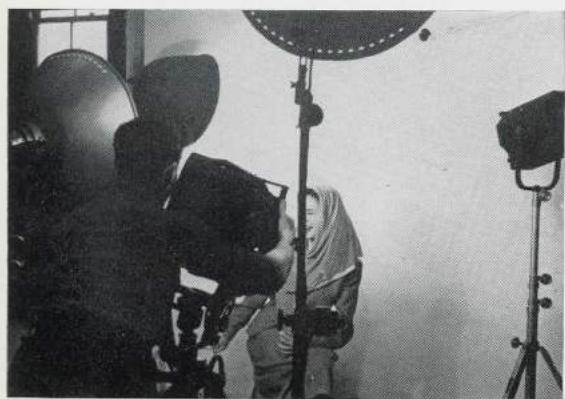
