And everywhere, on all of it, the brightness of the sun.*

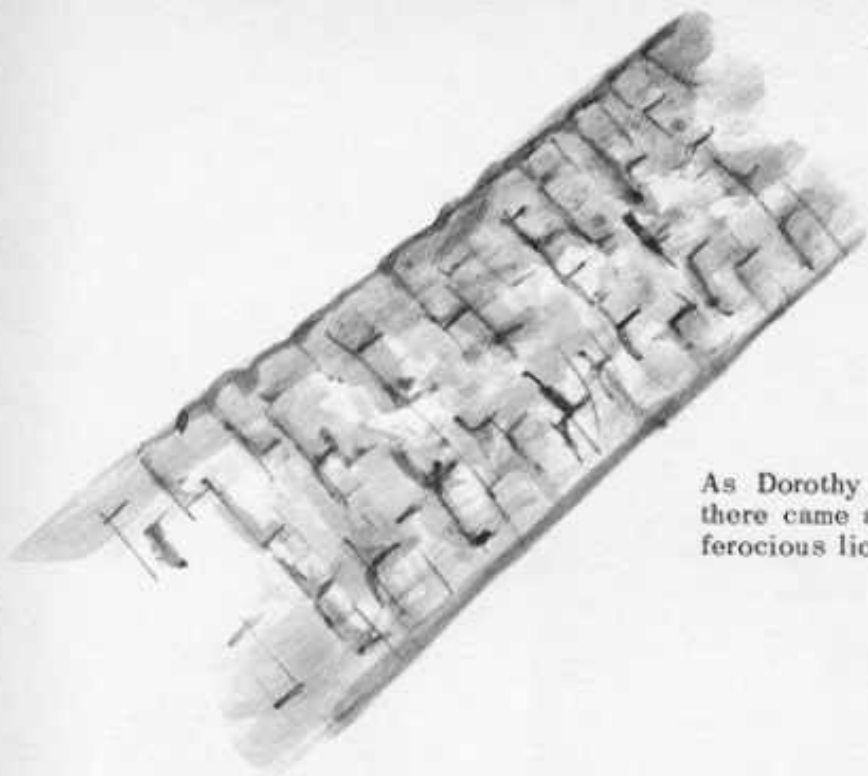
